Notes

This illustration is intended to demonstrate the notion of an online learning environment that provides students with program material, specific to their course(s) of study within an extended online support environment.

The intention is to enable students to address most of their learning and support requirements, at least in the first instance, through the online environment.

When this is not sufficient they have recourse to local face-to-face support. The intention is to support students' timely access to assistance online regardless of when they may have an issue.

Another key intention is to have one consolidated place where students can seek resources relating to all elements of their engagement with the institution so information about enrolment or administration processes (for example) needs to be as visible and accessible as their learning resources.
